TWO ARRESTED FOR THEFT OF SILVER

On Monday Evening, Officer Lloyd Oja received a report of missing silver from a storage unit near the Orleans transfer station. The victims indicated that dozens of family heirlooms, dating back to the 1800's were missing from the unit, and valued at over \$50,000. While on routine patrol during the midnight shift, Officer Daniel Elliott was spotlighting the storage facility and discovered this same unit was partially open and observed a pair of legs sticking out from under the garage door. Officer Elliott was able to identify this individual, and found additional property from this unit on his person. Arrested was Edmund Therrien, age 50 and homeless (formally from Orleans).

Sergeant William Norton and Officer Brian Carchedi were able to locate a vehicle registered to Therrien a short distance away with additional property within it. Also with the vehicle was Therrien's son, Peter "PJ" Therrien, age 21 also homeless and formally of Orleans. Edmund Therrien was charged with 2 counts of breaking and entering to a building/ nighttime for a felony, larceny from a building and possession of burglarious instruments. Peter Therrien was charged with receiving stolen property. Both were arraigned in Orleans District court, and released on personal recognizance.

During the subsequent investigation, the detective bureau was able to recover a large portion of the property reported stolen from three separate locations including stereo equipment, wedding gifts, and Waterford crystal. Additional information has been collected and the investigation is continuing.
