April 8: Blu Central

Blu Central (formerly Broadway Central) have been playing on and around Cape Cod for nine years. Their genre-bending stylings range from classical to punk and everything in between. Frank Poranski, guitar and vocals Lary Chaplan.

April 15: Michael Holt

Michael Holt's solo shows offer an unplanned and unpredictable mix of moods, genres, characters and instruments. Everything's possible, from original art songs and Bach inventions on the keyboard, to silly ditties and Dylan ballads on guitar.

April 22: The Wrack Line

The Wrack Line is Americana with elements of jazz, prog, and country. Our songs are about community, family, and the lives of working people. Our music is shaped by life on the edge of the Atlantic.

April 29: Ken Silvia

Ken Silvia is a velvet-voiced singer, songsmith, musician—soulful interpreter of rhythm & blues and vintage pop standards—with a versatile repertoire ranging from songs of the Beatles, Leonard Cohen, Willie Nelson and Ray Charles, as well as originals.

May 6: Bruce Maclean and Alice Malone

Bruce Maclean, longtime resident, performer and proprietor of Maclean Studio, is in his 45th consecutive year of playing music on Cape Cod. Performing this summer with

The Cyclones, The Cape Cod Rockabilly Music Conspiracy, The Marconies and The Allie Jason Show. Alice Malone semi-recently returned to the Cape, is a fiddler well versed in many genres who performs with several local bands including Toast and Jam and Crabgrass. They will be performing country and folk songs, and a couple originals.

May 13: Denya Levine and Julie Charland

Julie and Denya perform sea shanties, folk songs, familiar 20th century music, lively fiddle tunes, Celtic and country music. They play guitar, fiddle, Irish drum, and ukuleles, and their vocal harmonies sparkle with joyous energy.

May 20: Greg Johnson and Bob Chambers

Both artists have played in multiple bands and venues across New England. Bob spent many years in a band known as Andrea, The Judge and The Preacher while Greg still performs in a James Taylor Tribute Band called, "Shower The People."

May 27: Bourbon Sunset

Bourbon Sunset is a local vocal trio that blends tightly arranged 3 part harmonies with acoustic accompaniment. The trio performs a variety of music from bluegrass to folk to classic soft rock to gospel.

June 3: Catie Flynn

Catie Flynn is a singer songwriter born and raised on Cape Cod. She attended Berklee College of Music in Boston where she studied vocal performance and music business. Upon graduating from Berklee, Catie moved to Nashville, Tennessee. Now back on the Cape, Catie can be seen playing locally and around

June 10: Washashore Music
